An overview

Manabendra Sarma Girls' College, Rangia is the only premier female institution for higher education in the entire North Kamrup area, established in August 1984. The college has been torch bearer in the field of higher education for the girls in the vast and extensive area inhabited predominantly by socially and economically backward segments of the population. The institution was initiated by some notable enthusiastic educationists and the public in Rangia Girls' Higher Secondary School, Rangia. Thereafter, it was shifted to its allotted govt. land in Pub-Kachari Mahal and Pub-Barigog Mauza, Rangia. At the initial stage, the college was entitled as 'Rangia Girls' College' and later, the institution was renamed as Manabendra Sarma Girls' College in a public meeting in 1994 to memorise the veteran social-worker and politician of Rangia, Late Manabendra Sarma.

The college has been provincialised under The Assam Venture Educational Institutions (Provincialisation of Services) Act, 2011 and Amendment Act 2012 and an Act, 2017 (amended on 2018) w.e.f. 1st January, 2013 and 1st January 2021 respectively by the Govt. of Assam. The College is located at the heart of Rangia Town and is just 1 (one) km away from 27 No. National Highway. Manabendra Sarma Girls' College, Rangia has been registered under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act. Hope this will pave a new dimension to the entire college for all-round development. It is immense pleasure that the number of students have been growing day by day. It may be due to upliftment in overall academic as well as dynamic role of the entire college family.

Since its inception, the college has been playing a pioneer role in all spheres of socio-academic activities. Let us act for all round development of the institution for the greater interest of the womankind as well as the society.

M.A. courses under KKHSOU is also offered.

The Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under Gauhati University is based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The policy recognizes that higher education plays an extremely important role in promoting human as well as social well-being. From the Academic Session, 2023-24, Manabendra Sarma Girls' College is going to implement the FYUGP (Four Years Under Graduate Programme) in Arts under Gauhati University which is based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The FYUGP at GU is designed to offer two types of Bachelor's Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme- (i) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and (ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline. The word Stream here refers to Arts. In case of a degree in a stream, the student studies a multitude of different subjects, usually mixing different disciplines, which leads to a truly multidisciplinary degree. While in case of a degree in a discipline, the student is confined to a certain set of disciplines.

CURRICULAR GOALS :

The curricular and framework of FYUGP under NEP 2020 seeks to ensure the following for the students :

- (a) Flexibility to move from one discipline of study to another.
- (b) Opportunity for learners to choose the course of their interest in all disciplines.
- (c) Facilitating multiple entry and exit options with UG certificate / UG diploma / or degree depending upon the number of credits secured.
- (d) Flexibility for learners to move from one institution to another to enable them to have multi and / or interdisciplinary learning.
- (e) Flexibility to switch to alternative modes of learning (offline, ODL and Online learning)

The FYUGP is designed to cater to the diverse academic needs of the students and seeks to offer multiple entries/exits and obtain Certificate or a Diploma or Degree with or without Major or a Degree (Honours) with Research at various levels as stipulated under the policy.

ADMISSION

1. ELIGIBILITY

- ♦ A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution.

- ◆ Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference of major, if any. In case a student does not want to opt for any Major, students will be admitted on the basis of preferences of the subject combinations.
- ◆ Admission to a Programme or Major will be subject to availability of the subject and capacity of a college/department.
- ◆ No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless she fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by the university.

2. PROGRESSION AND EXITS

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

(a) After 1 Year

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirements is 44 (and 4 credit extra for the exit Vocational / Skill course).

(b) After 2 Years

One can exit the programme after two-year course as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirements is 84 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational / Skill course).

(c) After 3 Years

If a student completes 3 years, she can exit the programme. In this case the student will get a Bachelor's Degree. The minimum total credit requirements is 120.

(d) After 4 Years

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research. The minimum total credit requirements is 160.

It should be noted that any certificate / diploma / degree is awarded only if the student clears (i.e. passes) all the required courses (papers) till that point of time.

However, a student can complete her FYUGP within a maximum period of 7 years.

3. ABC (ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS)

The GU-FYUGP is directly connected to the ABC (Academic Bank of Credit) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earn at the end of an examination in GU-FYUGP, will be deposited in the ABC by the university.

As such it is mandatory that a student under GU-FYUGP register for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies.

*Aadhaar Card is mandatory for all the admitted students as it will be required for all purposes like creation of ABC, Registration with University, etc. Those who do not have Aadhaar Card, they must avail it within two/three weeks from date of admission.

4. MULTIPLE EXITS AND ENTRIES

The FYUGP allows students to have multiple exits and entries. That is a student can exit the programme, say after one year and then again can enter the institution as per the policy of Inter-institutional mobility (shown in point no. 5) Programme at a later time and can continue the programme from where she left. This process can be executed multiple times.

However, the entry into the programme is subject to availability of positions at that point of time and in that institute / college. Besides, the following should apply

- ♦ A student will get a certificate / diploma / degree on exit from the GU-FYUGP (depending on in which year the student exits), only when the student passes in all the minimum compulsory courses at that point of time.
- ♦ After an exit, either after Year 1 or 2, the student can seek an entry only into the same programme to which the student was admitted.
- ♦ When a student exits the GU-FYUGP after 3 years with a Bachelor's Degree, she can not seek re-entry into the programme at the fourth year, rather she will need to take admission into the Master's programme at the first year.
- ♦ As the contents (syllabi) of all the courses are subject to modification from time to time, when a student enters into the programme after an earlier exit, the contents of all courses will be what is as per the syllabi at the current point of time.

5. INTER-INSTITUTION MOBILITY

The GU-FYUGP allows a student for inter-institutional mobility, both for incoming and outgoing students. For this, GU will take into account the credits a student has in her ABC.

For an incoming student, the following should be observed:

- (a) The entry is subject to availability of seats in the concerned discipline.
- (b) The student need to fulfil all the academic prerequisites of the concerned discipline.
- (c) Gauhati University will award a degree to a student, only when the student will have completed 60% of the credits for core courses from GU.

6. CHOICE OF COURSES

Prerequisites

Prerequisites are conditions which need to be fulfilled prior to admission into the FYUGP. Each subject and its course (paper) has their own prerequisites, which need to be fulfilled by a student prior to enrolment. For details one can visit university website <https://gauhati.ac.in> or <https://nep.gauhati.ac.in>

Here, having a prerequisite necessarily means that the student needs to have passed in the subject. The details of these prerequisites are available in the FYUGP Information Booklet.

Requirements

As opposed to prerequisites, the requirements are conditions which need to be fulfilled when a student chooses a certain subject or course. For example, when a student wants to study Botany as a subject, Chemistry as another subject must be studied. The details of the requirements are available in the FYUGP Information Booklet.

Course options

Subject to fulfillment of prerequisites and requirements, a student can choose any subject as core subjects. The nomenclature of the degree awarded will be decided by the group to which at least two subjects belong.

7. EXAMINATION & GRADING

Examination

The examination modalities of GU-FYUGP will be as per GU's Examination Ordinance.

Grading

After successful completion of the programme, a student will be awarded grade. In GU-FYUGP, there will not be any percentage of marks, but all students will be provided SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) as per UGC's Curricular Framework.

8. FOURTH YEAR OF THE GU-FYUGP

The fourth year of the GU-FYUGP consists of one compulsory course on Research Methodology of credit 4, to be studied in Semester VII. The rest of the course consists of Advance Core Courses and a Dissertation. The details of the fourth year will be available later.

9. CURRICULAR COMPONENTS

The entire FYUGP curriculum is divided into two parts - (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below.

Syllabus- B.A. First Year to Third Year Under Four Year Under-Graduate Programme (FYUGP)

Semester : I : Total 6 Paper under two courses- Core Courses and Common Courses

Core courses

The core courses constitute of Major and Minor subjects. All Core Courses have a Credit allocation of 4.

* In case of major student, a student will choose one major subject and one minor subject.

* In the context of minor student, a student will choose two minor subjects.

Different core subjects are mentioned as follows –

(A) Core Course (Compulsory 2 Papers)

Major :

Any one of the following subjects (Credits 4 each)
Assamese, Education, Political Science, Economics and Arabic

Minor :

Any one of the following subjects except Major Subject (Credits 4 each)
Assamese, Education, Political Science, Economics, Arabic, Philosophy, English, History, Bodo

Common courses (Compulsory 4 Papers)

As the name suggests, these courses will have to be studied by all students of FYUGP. Together the common courses have a credit allocation of 12 divided over four subdivisions. They are:

- (a) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) -1
- (b) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) -1
- (c) Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC) -1
- (d) Value Added Courses (VAC) -1

A brief description of these courses are given below.

[A] SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SEC)

There are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 3. SEC will be major oriented in case of major student. And in case of minor student it will be 1st minor wise.

[B] ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSES (AEC)

Any one of the following Subjects (Credit 4 each)
MIL (Assamese, Bodo) Communication
Alternative English

[C] MULTI-DISCIPLINARY COURSES (MDC) CREDIT -3

Being Arts Stream the college has selected MDC under Humanities and Social Science.
Paper name : Makers of Modern Assam

[D] VALUE ADDED COURSES (VAC) (Credit-2)

Environmental Studies (Compulsory)



Semester-II : (Total 6 Papers)

(A) Core Course (Compulsory 2 Subjects)

Same rules of BA 1st sem are followed in case of both Major and Minor Students about core courses & common courses.

* In case of Major student the student has to deal with two major subjects Major-3 and Major-4 and one minor subject. (4 Credit each)

* And in case of minor student, the student has to deal with two papers in 1st minor-Minor-I (Course-3), Minor-I course-4) & Minor -2 (Course-3) (4 credit each)

Common courses (Compulsory 3 Subjects)

[A] SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SEC)

There are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 3.

SEC will be varied subject wise.



[B] MULTI-DISCIPLINARY COURSES

Being Arts Stream the college has selected MDC under Humanities and Social Science with credit 3.

Paper name : Understanding Globalisation

[C] VALUE ADDED COURSE (VAC) (2 CREDIT)

Details of the VAC will be declared later on, after clarified by the University.

SEMESTER-IV (5 PAPERS)

In 4th Semester the students have to study only core course.

* Those who are having major they have to deal with four Major subjects having 4 credit each. These courses are - Major-5, Major-6, Major-7 & Major-8

* And they have to deal with one Minor paper (Minor-4) having 4 credit.

Those who are minor students they have to deal with

SEMESTER-V (TOTAL 5 PAPERS)

In 5th Semester apart from study the core course, both the major and minor students have to under go an internship course having 4 credits (100 marks).

* In case of major students they have to deal with three major paper, namely Major-9, Major-10 & Major-11 and they have to study a minor paper named as minor-5. All paper carries 4 credit.

* In case of minor category students, they have to study 4 papers from their two subjects that carries 4 credit each. The name of the subject and course / papers are-

Minor-1 (Course-7)

Minor-1 (Course-8)

Minor-2 (Course-7)

Minor-2 (Course-8)

(N.B. : In summer break between 4th & 5th Semester (June-July, 2025) students have to undergo an internship course having 4 credit and the marks obtained in the intership course will be added in intership paper in Semester 5)

SEMESTER-VI (5 PAPERS)

In 6th Semester students have to deal with only core course. Both the major and minor categories of students have to study 5 papers with the credit allocation of 4 in each subject.

* For major students, they have to study 4 major papers, namely Major-12, Major-13, Major-14 & Major-15 and have to study a minor subject named Minor-6.

* For minor students, they have to study 5 papers

KEY POINTS TO BE TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT

- ◆ Entire process of submission of admission forms will be conducted in online mode through the admission portal of Manabendra Sarma Girls’ College.
- ◆ Students applying for FYUGP shall have to register in SAMARTH-e-gov suite for admission.
- ◆ Existing Govt. rules and notifications will be applicable for fee waiver scheme and other fee structure.
- ◆ Merit lists for admissions into B.A. 1st semester will be prepared strictly on merit basis following Govt. reservation policy.
- ◆ The date of admission will be publicly advertised through College notification as well as in the college website.
- ◆ The students and parents are requested to visit the college website REGULARLY msgcollege.co.in for subsequent notifications.

- ◆ The decision of the admission committee shall be final and binding on all.
- ◆ During the admission process, the candidate may have to fill up some other relevant form/forms in connection with her admission into the college.
- ◆ Fees once paid shall not be refunded.
- ◆ Seat of a student who remains absent in classes consecutively for the first 10 days will be forfeited and that seat will be filled up by new admission.
- ◆ Admitted Students shall have to pay registration, enrollment, and examination fees of boards and universities separately and upload relevant documents as per instruction.

ADMISSION RULES :

The Admission Committee shall regulate and supervise the whole process of admission. In case of any dispute, the decision of the Principal shall be final and binding. The admission process shall be in offline mode in the college campus on the specified dates and time to be announced through college website.

N.B.: Students must submit copies of Age Proof Certificate, Mark sheet, Caste Certificate, Domicile Certificate, Income Certificate/BPL Card etc. along with the form as per Govt. Notification. The original copies must be brought at the time of admission for verification.

RESERVATION OF SEATS:

Reservation of seats for SC/ ST/ OBC/ MOBC/Divyangjan will be according to existing government rules. A few seats will be reserved for deserving candidates in each class having state/national/international level proficiency in sports, NCC and cultural activities. Supporting certificates will have to be produced at the time of admission.

COLLEGE UNIFORM:

Wearing of College Uniform and Identity Card is Compulsory in the College

DISCIPLINE:

Manabendra Sarma Girls' College has a set of defined Codes of Conduct which can be found in the College Website.

All the students are required to go through the same and comply with them. All the students are expected to follow "Students' Charter" and "Code of Conduct" that are displayed in the college campus/website.

Use of Mobile Phones in the College Campus is restricted to only Academic Purposes. Students must attend 75% of the total classes held in each subject, otherwise they will be debarred from appearing in the sessional examinations. As a result, their internal assessment marks cannot be forwarded to Gauhati University for their semester-end exams and consequently, they will be declared as fail (Back) for that particular semester.

No student shall move out of the college campus during the college hours, roaming around market and nearby places, creating nuisance and engaging themselves in any anti-social activities, violation of which shall lead to stringent disciplinary action including expulsion from the institution, rustication and initiation of legal action. Loitering in front of the classrooms and corridors are prohibited.

- ◆ Every student must carry their Library Card (which is non-transferable)
- ◆ Major students will get one additional library card and all borrowers of library books will be responsible for the loss or damage of book/s borrowed from library and she will have to pay the cost of the books.
- ◆ No student will be allowed inside the college campus without uniform.
- ◆ Every student must appear compulsorily for all the internal tests/sessional exams/home assignments conducted by the concerned departments.
- ◆ Students should follow all the notices displayed in the Notice Board for their own benefit.
- ◆ Any application for obtaining certificates, railway concession, scholarship etc. must be submitted in advance to enable the office to deliver on time.
- ◆ Payment of scholarship will be made directly to benifisary account through online mode.
- ◆ Payment Receipt should be obtained for all amounts paid in the college office.
- ◆ College property to be used with utmost care and electric, water and other fixtures should not be tampered with.
- ◆ Students must attend all the functions of the college.

REGULATION OF FYUGP FOR SEMESTER SYSTEM AND GRADING SYSTEM AS PER G.U. GUIDELINES:

- ◆ Students' performance will be monitored throughout the semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical courses. Evaluation of the student's performance in each of the theory and practice papers will be done as per GU and AHSEC guidelines.
- ◆ Internal evaluation will be based on class attendance, library attendance, unit tests, home assignments, projects and sessional examinations.
- ◆ External evaluation will be done through a final examination at the end of each semester.
- ◆ A student must pass all his / her semester examinations within seven years from the date of admission to the first semester course.

- ♦ In case of any dispute regarding evaluation or unforeseen event, the matter may be placed in the committee of courses and studies (U.G.) for amicable settlement.
- ♦ For any matter not covered under this regulation for the semester system, the existing university rules and the Gauhati University Act 1949 (as amended till date) would be applicable.

Each and every student will be required to attend sessional, unit test, etc. whenever conducted by the Departments for the purpose of internal assessment as per G.U. regulations.
